Be very cautious in adding additional selenium to dairy rations where this product is used so as not to exceed the legal levels which is 0.3 ppm in the total ration. For beef cattle the maximum amount of selenium allowed per head per day is 3 mg or 3.5 oz of Buckeye Dry Cow Mineral per head per day.

1800 lb	Ground Oats or Corn
100 lb	Molasses

FEEDING DIRECTIONS

Feed 5 to 7 lb of the above listed grain mix per head per day to dry cows and heifers within 90 days of freshening plus 20-30 lb of good quality grass hay. The amount of hay will vary depending on the size and condition of the cows and heifers. A limited amount of corn silage may be fed, but care must be exercised so as not to allow the animals to become over-conditioned.

Each pound of the above grain mix contains 5.0% or 0.8 ounces of Buckeye® Dry Cow Mineral, therefore 6 lb of the above grain mix would contain 4.8 ounces or 0.3 lb of Buckeye® Dry Cow Mineral, which would contribute 13.4 gm of calcium, 16.7 gm of phosphorus, 4.1 mg of selenium, and 1100 mg of Vitamin E.
